ZAMIBIA 2019

ZAMIBIA IS AN ISLAND OFF THE COAST OF SOUTHEAST ASIA. IT HAS THREE MAJOR CITIES FLORIN, CORUSCANT, AND ALICANTE.

THE POPULATION IS 273, 580, 973


ECONOMY

- ▶ 17% of the population lives below the poverty line
- 5% unemployment
- GDP per capita: \$3150
- Government makes most of their money through tourism and exports

LAND AND ENVIRONMENT

- Marine Resources are being exploited
- Deforestation is unregulated and rampant

35% of land in Zambia is used for agricultural



GOVERNMENT

- Prime minister serves for 6 years
- Parliament consists of 45 regional representatives
- Finances are mostly balanced
 - However, multiple recent natural disasters have left the government with little to no funding

EDUCATION

- 92% of children under 16 are in school
- 14% of the population has a college degree
- 1 state university, 3 satellite universities, 6 independent, specialized universities
- 5% of university graduates are female

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

- Zamibia has developed strong trade agreement with China and India
- Some American companies have factories in Zamibia
- Terrorism is on the rise in Zamibia
- Zamibia has increased their security

ZAMIBIA 2019

MILITARY

- Zamibia has a military of 200,000
- Two-thirds of the military is naval
- Less than 10% of the military is the army

- > 95% of the population has access to electricity
- Zamibia has a crime rate of 250 per 100,000 citizens
- Zamibia has limited freshwater and a lack of water facilities
- The country predicts that it will run out of freshwater in less than fifteen years

PUBLIC HEALTH

- 2% infant mortality rate
- Life expectancy is 71
- Public health care is available
- 10% of the population contracts an infectious disease each year
 - Illnesses can result from hazardous landfill





AGRICULTURAL RESOURCES



COCONUT FARMING:

- Environmentally friendly expansion
- \$3 million annually for two years



Will bring in \$5 million a year (increasing 5% annually)



COCOA BEAN FARMING

- Not environmentally damaging or invasive
- One-time cost of \$3 million



Brings in \$5 million annually with an annual 5% increase



CHICKEN FARMING


- Least demanding farm animal - no pasture, low feed
- Year 1 cost of \$7 million




- Year 2 cost of \$4 million
- All following years have maintenance of \$2 million

THE POPULATION OF ZAMIBIA IN 2029 IS 303, 100, 360

ZAMIBIA 2029

ECONOMY

- 14% of the population lives below the poverty line
- GDP per capita: \$4,892
- Farm products account for 52% of the economy and 40% of exports
- Less than 4% unemployment

Zamibia contains six total commercial ports

ZAMIBIA 2029

LAND AND ENVIRONMENT

- Regulations have been instated to minimize deforestation
 - Deforestation has been curbed by 65%
 - No longer a cause of erosion or soil infertility
- New regulations on fishing allow fish populations to reproduce
 - 18% of the population are fishermen.

, 1070 of the population are noncommen

ZAMIBIA 2029

EDUCATION

- Public education has improved over the last decade
- 87% of children complete their public schooling
- ▶ 95% literacy rate

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

- Zamibia maintained its trade agreements with powerful countries
- Terrorism has seen a rapid decline over the past decade
 - Expansion of the military and presence of UN peacekeepers


INFRASTRUCTURE

- 97% of Zamibians have access to treated water
- Subsidizing public transportation has made it available to lower-income bracket families
- Ocean travel has seen an improvement in the last decade
- Zamibia has a crime rate of 150 per 100,000

HEALTHCARE

- Improve management of toxic chemical waste
- Decline in infectious diseases
 - Hepatitis A
 - Bacterial Diarrhea
 - Typhoid Fever
- ▶ 10% to 5%

GOVERNMENT FUNDS



ZAMIBIA AFTER THE UNDP

Our proposal is not perfect, and there are some problems it does not fix

- Inaccessibility to electricity
- Little improvement for rural areas
- Lack of sewage treatment facilities
